



**CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE
SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES FOR FUNDS RECEIVED BY THE
CALIFORNIA HEALTHCARE, RESEARCH AND PREVENTION ACT OF 2016**

The California Healthcare, Research and Prevention Tax Act of 2016 (Proposition 56) provides state and local agencies with funding to promote a healthier California by reducing illegal sales and marketing of cigarettes and tobacco products to minors.

Approved by voters in 2016, Proposition 56 increased taxes on cigarettes and other tobacco products by \$2.00 starting in April 2017. \$30 million of the resulting tax revenue is allocated annually to the Department of Justice to be distributed to agencies to help fund efforts directed at tobacco retailers such as license inspections, education, and minor decoy/shoulder tap operations. The funds also help support education and enforcement on school campuses as well as community education and enforcement programs. The data below is as of June 30, 2019.
